

PILOT Funded Project Proposal Evaluation Criteria

The PILOT steering Committee will consider the following questions when evaluating submitted proposals:

- 1. What makes the subject matter relevant to the IRI membership? What indicators are there that this is important to the wider IRI audience? Is it timely? Is there a sufficient gap in knowledge to warrant this project?
- 2. Is there a clear hypothesis?
- 3. What value will the project offer to participants? To the IRI membership?
- 4. Is there a strong project team in place?
- 5. What are the research methods proposed for getting the information needed? Will they get the information that is needed to complete the project?
- 6. What are the resources required to complete the project? Is there a plan in place for obtaining them? Is IRI able to meet the expectations and needs of the research team?
- 7. How will they know when they are done?
- 8. Is the timeline realistic?
- 9. What are the deliverables? Are they realistic?
